

## Core Facilities Code of Conduct

We expect all users and staff of the core facilities to behave in accordance with the faculty of Medicine & Dentistry's Code of Conduct (CoC) (<http://www.med.ualberta.ca/-/media/medicine/AboutUs/policies/fomd-code-of-conduct18062013.pdf>). Briefly, the CoC describes the expectations by the faculty for its members with regard to academic conduct. It encourages the promotion of voluntary corrective action taken to address misjudgment, lapses in professional behaviour or improper conduct. Failure to comply with this code of conduct - or follow facility staff directives - will result in revoking of privileges to the faculty's core facility resources.

The safety of both facility personnel and users is of primary concern. The FoMD's core facilities are multi-user research laboratories where many different samples are investigated. These may contain known or unknown human pathogens. Accurate information about the sample sources and potentially infectious agents must be reported upon request to the core. All appropriate biosafety measures must be undertaken in accordance with the university's biosafety guidelines (<http://www.ehs.ualberta.ca>).

Principal Investigators are responsible for assuring the technical competency of their research staff, students and employees in their laboratories and documenting on the job training as appropriate, for the materials in use in each laboratory. Please refer to the individual cores' working manuals for detailed information.
